

# Ex-County Clerk Wick Dies at Daughter's Home

Severt E. Wick, former Cascade county clerk and recorder and a resident of this county for more than half a century, died Wednesday in Bozeman where he had been living with a daughter for the last three years.

Funeral services will be held

there Friday morning at 11 at the Dokken, Nelson and Kippen mortuary, with burial in Bozeman. Wick, a native of Norway, died following an extended illness.

After coming to this country in 1886, Wick was engaged in mining in Minnesota, and two years later moved to Wyoming. He came to Great Falls in 1889 and was employed by the Nelson Coal Co., at Sand Coulee. He lived there 22 years.

In 1911, Wick was appointed deputy clerk and recorder. When Capt. J. E. Moran died in November, 1930, Wick was named his successor, serving until 1934, when he was unsuccessful in seeking reelection to the post. Wick's wife died here in 1943.

Survivors include the daughter, Mrs. Herman Dokken of Bozeman, and five grandchildren.
